Leavers Service – Friday 21st July

Year 6 parents/carers are welcome to join us on Friday to celebrate our wonderful Year 6 cohort and wish them well in their new schooling endeavours at secondary school. Please arrive for a 1:30pm start. You are welcome to take your child/ren after the service if you so wish.

School Hours

To bring the school into line with current Government guidance of 32.5 hrs per week, the school start time will be changing from September 2023. The expectation will be for children to arrive in the school grounds from 8:40am (drop and go will also operate from this time) then children will be seated in their classrooms at 8:45am. Pick-up time will remain at 3:15pm. Pre-school start time remains unchanged at 9:00am and pick-up is 3:00pm.

The KS1 and KS2 double gates will be locked at 8:45am. Please could all Pre-school parents/carers park in the main car park and access Pre-school via the small gate.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – this week at Pre-school we have engaged in logs of role-play; going on holiday, ice-cream shop and tea parties. We have matched numbers to quantity, 1-6, using a variety

of loose parts and marks. We have also enjoyed solving lots of number problems. Today we had lots of fun in the "blue sea"; blue shaving foam, drawing pictures, writing letters and numbers and generally scooping and plopping!

Class 1 – this week has been a busy and exciting week! We have been learning about pirates, where they come from and what they

did! The children had great fun making eye patches, telescopes and treasure maps; they were also made to walk the plank!! This week's HFWs are 'could' and 'people' and in maths we have been counting to and beyond 20.

Class 2 – this week Class 2 have finished their history topic. We learnt all about Mary Seacole and created a fact file about our knowledge. There were some really lovely pieces of work produced by the class. In English, they made a map of the route from Goldilocks' house to the three bear's

cottage. They thought carefully about other traditional tales and included many details in their maps, like the three little pigs' houses and the glass slipper that Cinderella dropped.

Class 3 had a visitor this week - Bob the bat spent the day in Class 3. We worked very quietly to not disturb him during the day. The children have talked lots about nocturnal animals during guided reading, The Hodgeheg. We have been working on fluency recently and using choral reading to develop this skill and the children have progressed very well. In writing, we have written newspapers and explored the features to include.

Class 4 - this week has been a busy week continuing to practise and prepare for the play. Next week, the children need to be practising the play in school having memorised all of their lines so will not have scripts, ready for

School Lunches

Unfortunately the paid school meal price will be increasing again in **September to £2.54 per meal**. This increase is as a result of current food and energy costs. We have been able to minimise this increase with AiP so that it falls in-line with the current Gloucestershire County Schools price.

School Debt Policy – September 2023

New measures we are introducing from September are as follows.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted and if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be sent in advance and your Parentpay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.

Updated regular booking forms will be sent home next week for regular users of the Breakfast Club and After School Club. Please could these be completed and returned before the end of the school year, where possible please, to reserve your places for September?
