### Panto Trip – Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> December

FoSM have now chosen the parent volunteers and parents will be informed next week if they have been selected. This has been done on a "helper for FoSM" basis and then names out of a hat. There were

a number of parents/carers who missed checking the snack box on the permission slips, so we are now going to provide this to all children unless parents/carers inform us that they **do not wish** their child to have this.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school -** This week at Pre-School we recapped the activities we did over the half term break and explored the autumn bags the children returned. We have talked a lot about Bonfire Night and what fireworks we saw! We have used cardboard tubes with paint to make firework pictures, shiny paint pens to draw on black paper and marble rolling in trays to make a firework affect with different coloured paints.

Towards the end of the week we have touched on Remembrance Day and why the children may see people around them wearing red poppies. The children have made collage poppies using different craft materials and red stickers to make spotty poppy pictures. The children have also watched a short video called 'Cbeebies Poppy Animation', which is a beautiful explanation about why we have Remembrance Day.

**Class 1** – The children in Class 1 have blown the adults away this week with their reading and writing. They've all returned from half term with a great attitude towards their learning and we have all seen the progress they have all made, especially in phonics.

Reception have learnt 5 new sounds this week (f, ff, I, II, ss) and we have been talking a lot about digraphs and how they are two letters that make one sound together. The HFW's this week are (be,

she, he, we, me, of). They also enjoyed a history workshop on Friday, where they learnt all about Neil Armstrong, in preparation for our spring term topic.

Year 1s have been practising their split digraphs and have learnt two knew diagraphs, Green Froggy 'ea' and the Silent Ghosty 'ea', which makes the 'e' sound, found in words such as 'bread'.

Class 2 – it's been a VERY busy week in Class 2. A friendly Alien crash-landed in our playground and we went out to investigate the crash site. The children found some yellow fur and we think that the alien is hiding somewhere around the school. A message from Mrs Thomas told us that her name is Beegu and that she is scared. The children have also enjoyed their history workshop today; during the session they learnt some more information about Neil Armstrong. They acted out and created a timeline of his life, as well as thinking about what it would've been like to be the first person on the moon. They really enjoyed their day and have all behaved really well.











Class 3 had an exciting week when a mysterious bag of objects were delivered. Inside included feathers, a hat and a letter and our new book, 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx'. We have been looking at inverted commas to show speech this week and thinking about what characters in the book might say to each other. In history, the children explored sources of evidence to uncover clues about what the Ancient Egyptians did for fun and compared to what we do today. The Y3 children have impressed me with their knowledge of 3D shapes and both year groups have started their multiplication units of work.

Class 4 have had a very busy week back in school! On Tuesday, we had PC Greg, our Schoolbeat Officer, talking to C4 about Internet Safety. The children were told about how to keep themselves and others safe, alongside the age restrictions that are in place for many common apps and games. This surprised some of the children along with how the police deal with malicious communications; the children were encouraged to go home and do 3 things: check their group chats and make sure they knew everyone in them; check they follow only their friends and unfollow anyone they do not know; and, check their online friend lists and unfriend anyone they do not know. Class 4 also started their Gymnastics sessions which they really enjoyed and they went to Woodside this week to celebrate Remembrance with a range of activities: a museum history box, a talk with the Cadets and an art activity – it has been a great opportunity to link up with the Year 5/6 children from Soudley and Woodside – thank you to Miss Carlson for organising it and to Woodside for hosting us.
