Strike action by members of the National Education Union

I am writing to you about forthcoming strike action by the National Education Union (NEU), one of the main teaching trade unions. You will have seen coverage of this in the news, and I wish to inform you about the impact this is likely to have at our school.

There are three national and one regional day strikes planned. The strike days that are may affect schools in this area are:

- ·Thursday 2 March 2023
- ·Wednesday 15 March 2023
- ·Thursday 16 March 2023

Clearly this is a difficult situation; I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those who wish to strike will have thought long and hard about their decision.

One of the key issues will be to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike. If any teachers are absent on the strike days, but there are enough staff to supervise, their class will be open or partially open but will not be taught usual lessons. If we partially open, vulnerable children and those of key worker parents would be prioritised for supervision.

Class Snippets

Pre-school – this week we have read "Snail Trail" and "Matisse's Magical Trail" – which follows Matisse the Snail on his journey through modern art. We have explored spirals and enjoyed creating spirals and snail inspired crafts. We are also planning to re-create our versions of Henry Matisse's well known painting "The Snail".

Class 1 - This week we have been exploring materials again and have been discussing their properties. We decided that it wouldn't be a good idea to build a house out of paper, as The Big Bad Wolf could easily blow it down. This week's sound is Angry Red A, 'ai', found in words such as rain and maid and lots of children have been using our new sound in their independent writing. The children have also been working very hard to find 1 more of a given number and showing this using Tens frames in Maths.

Class 2 – This week, Class 2 have started our new class book Grandad's Camper. We shared this book with the school for national storytelling week; however, we have also been using it for writing. On Tuesday we found a box of objects in the class labelled "Grandad's stuff". We were quite confused how it arrived there but we worked out that the objects inside must belong to a Grandad. We found a flag, a keyring, a map, a car air freshener and a packet of seeds. We used our inference skills to share some of our ideas about what Grandad likes and who he could be. On Wednesday we read the book and found out that lots of our predictions had come true! They have been brilliant writers this week and I can't wait to see them make more progress next week!

Class 3 have had an amazing week! They have written their own sequel for 'Wisp' and are going to contact the author to share their stories, all the way in Australia! The children have really impressed the adults with their focus in writing and their use of all of the features they have been taught. In maths, the Y3s have finished their subtraction unit and are moving on to explore fractions and Y4s are working hard on column addition and subtraction. Children have been enjoyed yoga and a film Thursday afternoon, as their class treat for winning stars.

Class 4 children played their flutes in a performance for Parents and Pre-school this week and they did really well. They have learnt so much in the 10 weeks they have had Miss Wilson and it was great for them to perform to a live audience – we were very proud of their performance. They have also been working on their writing this week, writing an alternative ending to The Highwayman which has encouraged them to use their imaginations.

This week, we have shared a range of stories across the school along the theme of 'diversity', passing the books along to the next class each day. Children have all been able to talk about messages that they can take from each book.

Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers for February half term are now open until the 7 February. Voucher emails will be sent out on 13 February. Please encourage parents to check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.

If parents have not received their vouchers by the 14 February please encourage them to email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so that we can look into it.

This February half term, Gloucestershire County Council are providing vouchers to eligible families who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of our commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and they are separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive benefits-related free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. We are unable to consider college and sixth form students, as well as children who receive infant free school meals (available to all children from reception to year 2), as they are not eligible for this scheme.

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive £15 per child, for the February half term week.
