NEU member strike action

The NEU have declared the Weds 5th and Fri 7th July to be strike days for their members. As advance notice, our school will be affected, **school will be closed on Weds 5th July** and will be **open** on Fri 7th July.

We appreciate that class/school closures are disruptive and are aware that all four teacher and leader unions are balloting members regarding co-ordinated strikes in the autumn term. This is based on under-funding for schools, inspection, workload, staff retention and below-inflation rate pay matters. Whilst staff do not want to strike or lose pay, they are willing to support potential longer term benefits for education and we ask for your continued understanding at this difficult time.

KS2 Performance letters for Classes 3 and 4

Pre-school – we have read Sea Mermaid and Maisie Mouse goes to the Seaside. We have used CDS, pomp oms and paint to create fish and sand and sandpaper to make sandcastles for our beach display. Some of the children also enjoyed their visits to Class 1 on Wednesday and Thursday.

Class 1 – we have had a very busy week in Class 1; all of the children have been busy during their bump up days, doing lots of fun activities in Class 2 with the Class 2 adults. Reception have continued their RSE learning and were looking at the different life stages of human beings. All of the children were very knowledgeable at identifying physical change and identifying the difference between the different stages as we grow. Our HFW's this week are 'their & our'.

Class 2 - this week has been so busy in Class 2. We have really enjoyed our bump up days and we are excited to spend the next few weeks together as our current class. The children in Class 2 have started a new English topic of the Goldilocks Project. Over the next few weeks we will be looking at three different books which tell the story of Goldilocks in different ways. This week we have been describing Goldilocks using rich adjectives, we started the week just using adjectives on their own and we built our knowledge to create a wanted poster to help the police find her.

Class 3 - it was lovely to welcome the Y2 children into Class 3 this week for their bump up days. We enjoyed getting to know each other and played some games. We read 'Mabel and the Mountain' about Mabel the fly with big dreams and talked about not giving up, when things are tricky. We made our own little Mabel fly complete with googly eyes, wings and hats!

We had a brilliant session at gymnastics this week and the children worked on jumping along the beam, swimming on the bars and practised handstands!

Launch of Safe Space

Newent Secondary School Open Day

Due to industrial action, the Year 5 open morning planned for 5th July has been cancelled. A new date will be announced shortly.

School Hours

To bring the school into line with current Government guidance, the school start time will be changing from September 2023. Children will be welcome to come into the school grounds from 8:40am and will need to be ready to go into their classrooms at **8:45am**. Pick-up time will still be 3:15pm. Pre-school start time remains unchanged at **9:00am** and pick-up is 3:00pm.

School Lunches

Unfortunately the paid school meal price will be increasing again in **September to £2.54 per meal**. This increase is as a result of current food and energy costs. We have been able to minimise this increase with AiP so that it falls in-line with the current Gloucestershire County Schools price.

School Debt Policy – September 2023

This week the school debt for Breakfast Club and After School Club has reached an unprecedented high. As a result we are have made the decision to introduce some tighter measures for the use of these services to eliminate this ongoing issue and maintain zero debt for the school. This change will take effect from the new school year.

Parentpay gives parents/carers the ability to load their child's account in advance and this must be done prior to booking/taking sessions at either Breakfast Club or After School Club. Much the same as our booking system for school lunches, you pay and we then we provide the service. The current practice by some parents/carers of using the clubs and then crediting their accounts some-time after, usually on "pay day" will no longer be acceptable and you will not have access to the services whilst your account is in debt. We hope that this advance notice and the summer holidays

will assist you in being able to turn this financial situation around enabling you to be in a position to pay in advance. We have also witnessed a culture of booking a place and then not cancelling that place with the school office, which we are also addressing (all cancellations much be at least 24hrs notice or you will still be charged). The new measures we are introducing from September are as follows.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted and if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parentpay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.

There will be updated booking forms for the clubs and these must be completed, signed and handed in prior to the start of the new school year to reserve your place for September.

FSM Summer Holiday Scheme

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers summer holiday period are now open until the 11 July. Voucher emails will be sent out from week commencing 17 July. Please check your junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.

If parents have not received their vouchers by the 19 July please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so that they can look into it.

This summer holiday, Gloucestershire County Council are providing vouchers to eligible families who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of our commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding and they are separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive benefits-related free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire.

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive 2 weeks of vouchers for the summer holiday at £15 per child per week, whilst the Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF) provides support for the remaining 4 weeks of the holiday.
